Did you know? Denisa is the Restorative Action (RA) facilitator in ATS this year and has already facilitated a number of learning circles with youth in the school! She has also provided several tips and strategies for discussions to start having with your teens which we will share each week.

Conversation Starter for Parents and Caregivers: Caregivers RA facilitators have found that students enjoy talking about and understanding their conflict style as characterized through animals. A shark is directive and competitive. They are goal-oriented, more aggressive in their communication to resolve conflict, authoritative, uncooperative, and intimidating and like to win. This can be useful when a situation demands an immediate response for someone's safety and taking charge. A turtle is avoiding and can ignore and hide from conflict. They are often trying to make peace or please everyone around them, but their needs are not met. This is useful when we need to calm ourselves and give time to think. An owl is collaborating and use problem-solving approach. They work to find solutions for everyone and they attack the problem not the person. It is important for a youth to understand which animal they are, but equally important to understand which animal their parent is. Have some conversations around the different styles and come up with some strategies to make sure everyone is heard and understood in a conflict situation.
