Weekly Tip #6: Be curious in communication in terms of what your child needs from you. As parents, there can be a quick response to fix a situation or problem. However, sometimes they do not need you to fix their situation or offer advice, but rather to listen to what they have experienced. Youth need to learn how to handle certain situations on their own rather than someone solving it for them. When your child comes to you, ask them what they would like from you? Do they need help, advice, encourage or someone to sit and listen. By asking this question, it opens to lines of communication and allows them to express their needs in the situation.
